The Eden Project in Cornwall (UK) is an educational charity which has resulted in the transformation of a derelict clay pit into a 'Garden of Eden', an educational facility with huge greenhouses or 'biomes' showcasing plants and landscapes from around the world.

Come to a film presentation by award-winning documentary filmmaker Robin Kewell who filmed over 4000 hours of footage from when Tim Smit conceived the idea of the Eden Project in 1997, right up to the day it opened in a blaze of glory in 2001. This is an insider's view of how the Eden Project came about, a privileged look into how a small team of people turned a derelict industrial wasteland into what has been described as the 8th Wonder of the World.
