This Workshop is for You

What are Tools for Engagement?

Tools for engagement are processes and approaches that generate connection and release wisdom within groups of people.

They foster synergy and provide ways for people to participate in intention, design and outcomes/decisions/actions.

It is about shifting from informal socialising or opinionated discussion to an attitude of thoughtful speaking and deep listening.

Tools for engagement enable:

- Creation of a context which nurtures an alternative future, one based on inclusiveness and hospitality
- Initiation of conversations that shift our experience, through the way we bring people together and the nature of the questions we ask.

Workshop Content

There will be a blend of short presentations, practical skills exercises, and small group discussions about practical action, focused on:

- Leading and influencing transformational change
- Conversation as a core business process
- Identifying the highest potential
- Strengths and asset focus
- Methodologies to enable co-creation, collective wisdom, self-organisation
